



CORONA SESSION INVITES THE CONGREGATION TO CONSIDER THE MANHATTAN DECLARATION

The Manhattan Declaration was developed by a group of committed Christians in New York in October 2009 as a Call of Christian Conscience for consideration by all Christians to take an individual stand on three of the major issues facing us all. Drafted by Chuck Colson and seminary and law professors, the Declaration first summarizes the joint actions of individual Christians over the ages against the evils of their times and provides a statement of faith generally and, specifically, on the principles of:

- The Sanctity of Life,
- The Sanctity of Marriage, and
- Religious Liberty

The Session invites us all to consider adopting the Manhattan Declaration personally which may be done at http://www.manhattandeclaration.org.
