A total of 6,358 people signed up by the first registration deadline (June 30) to take advantage of the lowest conference fee. This was a larger than expected number of




people to commit to Urbana by the early registration deadline, and comes despite a bleak economic environment that has stretched thin the resources of many mission agencies, ministries, and businesses.
