Moment for Missions Report from Monica Sawyer

What a huge blessing it was for Abby and myself to be asked to go to Turkey on a short term mission trip to work with Jim and Renata Bultema, missionaries whom Corona has supported for over 18 years. The staff, counselors and campers at Olive Grove 2010 camp benefit richly from being set apart in a beautiful natural environment to draw nearer to God and to serve Him as they facilitated the camp's many wonderful activities. The campers became the beneficiaries of months' worth of planning and preparation as they enjoyed the beauties of friendship, fun activities and the fellowship that comes from feasting on God's word daily. Even the pension owners benefited richly from the songs of praise and worship, laughter, fun, revenue along with God's richest blessings poured upon them and their land for the two weeks they hosted us.

As the Craft Director, I supplied materials and taught a craft each morning for Kids and Youth (ages 7-18) and provided projects for the "drop-in" craft free time every afternoon. It was a rich and rewarding experience to be able to teach crafts that the kids could easily replicate at home for fun, to use as games and to give as family gifts. Each day's morning devotion time held a special lesson for the kids on biblical character traits such as loyalty, responsibility, companionship, decisiveness, determination, joy, simplicity, generosity, gratitude and kindness which we were able to weave discussion through as we taught our crafts.

As a helper, I was able to provide a much needed hat for Jim (a funny story), provide elbow work on laundry, snap pictures for Renata's parents and the parents of Joel so they could regularly see their other four sons at camp while they were with Joel in Germany. I organized and fortified craft supplies for Olive Grove and provided additional supplies for St. Paul Union Church Sunday School and Women's Outreach ministries. As staff, I regularly encouraged other staff (with three helpers), counselors and campers specifically thanked and acknowledged our pension owners for their wonderful hospitality.

So, who did we minister to? As staff, we ministered to each other and of course to the campers. Who ministered to us? Staff and then also the campers! Brotherly love during worship singing was priceless and the kids always helped with craft clean up until the job was totally done! As an "older" camp person, I was also blessed by two very nice young gentlemen Nathan and Chris who assisted me hiking trails and carted my luggage regularly.

All in all it was a time set apart to really live in community with and for God's children that I





shall never forget. Counselors poured themselves out and into the lives of their campers every day. Seven people became baptized and at least that many gave their hearts to the Lord while at camp.

While camp was a lot of hard work it was also a lot of fun! Once again, many thanks for Corona's generosity including many individual gifts which paid for the craft supplies. God used the funds given to ease the burden of camp costs overall and that is not to be taken lightly.

Sue Newland, one of Corona's Missionaries with Wycliffe Bible Translators, visited Corona on July 18th. Sue was sent out from Corona back in 1984, and so when she visits it's a great chance to catch up with old friends and make new friends. She also brought her mom Peggy from Topeka, Kansas this time. Sue is currently stationed in Calgary, Alberta and she told us during the Adult Sunday School session about the software project that she has been working on that allows for very fast checking of the Bible translation by the field workers of Wycliffe. Her current project involves modifying this software to work on a different operating system that allows it to be used more openly, and in more countries with languages that are more difficult to edit and translate on a computer. This will help speed up the process of providing an accurate translation of the Bible to more people in their own language around the world.

Report from Elyse Miller

As many of you know, I traveled to Haiti in May through my college bible study group and the Southern Baptist Disaster Relief organization. I knew from the start that I would be doing "demolition," but it was only once I'd arrived that I understood that meant two weeks shoveling rubble off surviving foundations so owners could rebuild their houses. Over that two week period, my team cleared two sites (the first of which is in the attached photo) and started work on a third, and we began construction on one house and assembly of the walls of five more.

Haiti totally changed my outlook, probably in ways I don't even realize. I did learn how blessed we are to have so much wealth and so many resources at our disposal in our country. But more personally, God taught me humility. After getting dehydrated and heat-sick on my first day of work, I was sent to spend a day teaching vacation bible school in the local church. I was pretty embarrassed to be unable to handle the demolition work that day, but in hindsight the times I spent with the Haitian children were the most rewarding experiences in Haiti. They taught me that we don't have to speak the same language to play together, and that making kids smile is important work too.

Another meaningful experience took place on a day that we ended work early. We were sent out in small groups to walk through the

neighborhood (an activity that was otherwise forbidden for security reasons) so that we would have a chance to talk to people about Christ. I wasn't so sure about taking two hours to try and convert people we would never meet again, but we wound up having a really engaging discussion with a seventeenyear-old boy named David. David speaks English and has been reading his Bible, but he had a lot of questions about a God that he sees as a legalist. When asked what the greatest commandment is, he responded, "Honor your parents." We tried to explain to him that God is love, but unfortunately an argument sprung up between David and a Haitian pastor/interpreter in our group, and the conversation ended with an angry David telling us that he never wanted to see the man again. I've been asking people to pray for him, that he will keep asking questions and keep looking for the loving God we failed to show him that day.



The whole country of Haiti needs prayers, for the thousands of people without permanent shelter and for the families that lost loved ones in the earthquake. I'd like to thank you all for praying for me while I was in Haiti, and for all of your support!
