

From my mind's eye . . .


We have begun one of the greatest seasons of the year. It is the coming of the Christ child. This child is none other than the very savior of our world. God has always been with us as He is our creator. Even so, this coming is a one-of-a-kind moment when all of life is being remade or at least has the possibility of being remade. It is this "coming" which we talk about, but which often finds us ill prepared to fully receive.

If we are not very careful the commercialism of "Black Friday" and the "Christmas Season" distract and even alienate us from the reason for this season. We fall prey to the commotion and chaos of buying presents, preparing our homes inside and out, hosting parties and attending gatherings. We barely have time and energy to say "Happy Birthday" to Jesus. We do all this preparation in the name of the One who is coming, even though what we do has very little to do with Him.

Advent is the time to prepare for God's coming to be with us. Advent speaks of the waiting and the hoping of what has been promised.

From the writings of the prophet Isaiah, chapters 7-9, we receive a pretty clear picture of God's promise that He will join us. In Isaiah 7:14 and again in Matthew 1:23, we read these words: "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" — which means, 'God with us."

One way to help our hearts be prepared for Christ's arrival is through an advent guide created by Urban Skye Ministries, which will be the basis of the preaching through December. (This guide can be found in the foyer at Corona.) We are looking at characters in the Christmas story who find themselves on the outside or at least were considered outsiders from the Jewish culture. I want to invite you to stand outside of the distractions we often create, by making the weeks of Advent preparation for receiving Jesus.



There is no getting around the fact that we will experience hustle and bustle. But let us take a breath and pay just a little bit more attention to why we have all of this commotion. Let us try to center more on the reason for the season - our Savior Jesus, God's only Son.

Some of you enthusiastically attended the recent October all church retreat, while others were unable to attend. Good news! The retreat is still alive and well for all of you because of both a video and a special witnessing tool.

The gist of the retreat was a desire to make our faith more of a 24/7 experience both as individuals and as a church community. If we are going to really impact our homes, our community, and our world, we need to become day by day more like Christ. We really can't become more like Him by just trying harder to overcome our anger, lust, etc., which unfortunately just results in us becoming more like the angry elder brother in Luke 15. Fortunately, Christ modeled for us how to become more like himself by 1) having a relationship with God, 2)

meditating on scripture, 3) being filled by the Holy Spirit, and 4) abiding in God's presence.

At the retreat we had four Corona speakers address each of the above keys for being transformed into a new life. We captured those four speakers on video so that you can either experience much of the retreat for the first time, or get re-energized for a second time! You can watch these videos either individually, or be part of a small group forming in January where you can watch and then discuss what you saw together.
