

From My Minds Eye...

I want to thank all of you who came to our annual congregational meeting January 20th. It was a good, even great time together sharing food, fellowship and 'meeting'. One piece of the night that was very important to me was our discussion of our new Heritage worship service time. I know for some of you this will not really impact your life. At the same time I realize that this does cause some concerns for others.



The definitive way we as Christians are to live our lives is written by the Apostle Paul in Philippians 2:3-4 "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others."

That being said, Session has been wrestling the past six months with how to create more space for fellowship time and still encourage Sunday classes on Sunday morning. The new schedule is the answer Session came to. Here are the two schedules.

Old Schedule:

Heritage Service:	8:45 A.M.
Sunday School:	10:00 A.M.
Contemporary service:	11:00 A.M.

New Schedule:

8:30 A.M.
9:45 A.M.
10:00 A.M.
11:00 A.M.


In the Old Schedule there was only 15 minutes between the Heritage Service ending and Sunday School beginning. There simply was not enough time for both fellowship and Sunday School beginning on time. It often left Sunday School with 30 minutes for the teaching time. Communion Sunday's complicated matters even more so. The new schedule will normally provide 20 minutes for fellowship time prior to the beginning of Adult Education at 10:00 a.m..

Some have suggested we move the contemporary service to 11:15-12:30. On Communion Sunday's this would push the ending time to 12:45. I as your pastor and Session believe this is too late into the afternoon to end this service.

In light of all that has been said, I want to challenge us as the body of Christ to live in the posture of the other. Let us embrace "considering others" as the way Corona Presbyterian Church will live out being Christ's body.

Moment for Missions Corona Honors one of its' Mission Senior Statesmen, Bill Eddy, who is still serving with Wycliffe Bible Translators at age 83! Well done, faithful servant.

Bill and Maxine Eddy were led by God to meet at Mercy Hospital in Denver in 1951. Bill accepted Maxine's invitation to come to a Corona Mariners (Bob & Leona Jones, Georgia Gray, Bob & Dorothy Gross, Arlo & Harriet Gerstenberger, and others) swimming party and they were married in 1954. They served together with Wycliffe Bible Translators 31 years in Peru and Ecuador. Bill was a pilot-mechanic, and Maxine a registered nurse. They helped found the Wycliffe Linguistic Research Center, "Limoncocha," in Ecuador's pristine Amazon Region. The Lord kindly gave them four little girls who grew up there. They also helped found the all-Ecuadorian ORGANIZACION DE APOYO A LOS TRADUCTORES DE LA BIBLIA (OATB). It means Bible Translation Support Organization. It has been mobilizing Ecuadorian Bible translators to disciple the twelve language groups now with Bibles in their own languages. Also it has been sending Bible translators to far-off countries in Asia and the Pacific. Maxine went to join Jesus in 1991. Two years later Bill remarried a dear lady in his Sunday school class. She was called to heaven in 1995. Now Bill, at 83, counts it all joy to be able to recruit personnel for Wycliffe from his Dallas office. MARANATHA!!! You can contact Bill at bill eddy@wycliffe.org.

We are thankful to the Lutz family for this gift that has already been used to provide a gift to each of the missionaries that we currently support. In addition we hope to assist Corona members in participating in short-term mission trips in 2010.
