




- they will be available every communion Sunday,

thing for which you would like to ask forgiveness,

- after you write it down, it will disappear in about a minute or so.
- as you linger and pray over your phrase or word, it disappears. It is your time to share it with God.

We ask anyone who has creative ideas about how to enhance the worship aspects here at Corona to contact Tom Gengler or Pastor John and let them know of your thoughts.

# From my mind's eye . . .

These past few weeks have been a whirlwind of activity.

On January 8 we had a special forum during our Sunday school hour to talk about "The Fellowship of the Presbyterians" (FOP). On January 15 Corona voted unanimously as a church to become affiliate members of the Fellowship, with the understanding that Session will continue to investigate the FOP (both as a Union church and New Reformed Body) and Evangelical Presbyterian Church (EPC) as requested by several members of Corona.

Becoming an affiliate member means that we are in association with FOP. We are agreeing with the values of the FOP and want to be in relationship with them at the most basic level. I have traveled to Orlando to FOP's covenanting conference (Jan. 18-21). At this conference the New Reformed body we have talked about was introduced: "Evangelical Covenant Order of the Presbyterians" (ECO).


To the right is a simple diagram that will help illustrate how the PCUSA, FOP and ECO relate.

What does all this mean?

We are affiliate members of FOP, which is within the PCUSA. The Evangelical Covenant Order of the Presbyterians (ECO) is a new Presbyterian denomination, which is under the umbrella of the FOP. ECO is an expression of the values and beliefs of the Fellowship of Presbyterians.

# And now for something completely different... The Annual Meeting

## **Missions**

# Dr. Ed Ho: Corona being missional in Denver and in the uttermost parts of the Earth

Corona has a long history of over 50 years of supporting medical missions both locally and around the world.

For example, doctors from Corona have been involved in the establishment and support of the Denver Inner City Health Center (ICHC) which provides medical services for the poor and uninsured since the mid-1980s. Dr. Duane Claasen, a former Corona member, was one of the founders of this ministry and served there until 2005.

Medical missions in Taiwan and China have also been supported by Corona since the early 1950's through the ministry of Dr. Frank and Sally Dennis, Corona missionaries. Dr. Dennis was involved in the establishment of a hospital in Taiwan and has served with Evergreen Mission's medical efforts in Shanxi province in China for the last 15 years.

Dr. Ed Ho of Corona is presently serving as a volunteer physician at the Denver Inner City Health Center. Another member of Corona, Bev Longe, has also served as a volunteer there.

Dr. Ho has travelled to some of the most remote parts of the world assisting ACCTS, another Corona sponsored mission. ACCTS goes to China 'To Listen, To Learn, and To Love'. Since 2004 Dr. Ho has served on short term medical missions almost every year in China with ACCTS. He has assisted village doctors, hospitals, and church clin-

ics in many locations in China. In Yunnan Province he has provided medical help to minority (Miao, Li, Lisu, etc.) patients in mountainous regions where some people have never been able to have access to a doctor. Bill Henderson of Corona, a retired EMT, has travelled with Dr. Ho to these remote areas of China.

approximately \$1,200 a month more than 2011 budget. Much of the increase comes from the church building needs, maintenance costs for equipment, keeping our youth directors at threequarter time and a two percent staff raise. With all of this in mind, I want to invite you to prayerfully consider how you can help our church meet our 2012 budget.

Think, consider, pray and listen in your praying to what God is calling us to.
