Moment for Missions <mark>Sue Newland</mark> Wycliffe in Calgary, AB

Sue Newland is with Wycliffe Bible Translators on a software development team, currently in Calgary, Alberta. She works with developing the software that Wycliffe uses to make it much easier to check for accuracy and consistency when translating the Bible into other languages. Recently she has been working with the team to port the software from Windows to Linux (a different operating system) which will make it easier to expand the use in other parts of the world. A recent praise is that they were able to demonstrate a working Translation Editor on the Linux system in 2009. She'll also be working on a project to upgrade some older software that has become difficult to extend and add new features due the way it was originally implemented. Please pray for Sue and the team to be able to make good decisions on how to upgrade the software so that the translators can be more effective in translating the Bible into more languages that currently have no translation of the Bible. Sue is planning on visiting Corona in the Spring of 2010, look for updates soon on specific dates.


