Challenges The last seven months have been emotionally and spiritually challenging. Last September, I left a great job here in Denver for what we believed would be my "dream job" in Houston, Texas.

"Our" Plan We put our house on the market and I began commuting weekly, leaving Lamandra to care for our daughters Margaret (3 yrs) and Adelaide (2 yrs) on her own. Although it was difficult being apart and trying keeping the house show-worthy with two young children, I was focused on excelling in my new role and helping to get the new company off the ground. Unfortunately, this often meant that I didn't get to come home for several weeks at a time. Needless to say, this situation was unsustainable and it forced us to reflect on our priorities and reach out to the Lord.

Lord Help Us We prayed fervently that the situation would be resolved – we asked God to work things out the way WE thought they should be resolved. But as you know, God doesn't work that way. So, over time, our prayer changed from "Lord, help us sell our house so we can be together" to "Lord, help us learn the lessons we need to learn from this experience so we can be together soon". We were truly humbled through this process and desperate for His saving grace.

Answered Prayers There were several points over the course of this period when we very clearly felt the Lord's hand at work. The most clear and inspiring instance involved the circumstances that ultimately brought me back home to Denver. After much prayer, I was led to resign from my job in Houston before securing another job in Denver. This was stressful and unnerving given the state of the economy, but we both believed that the Lord was calling us to step out in faith.

"Gods" Plan We were not disappointed...not only was my separation from the Houston company very amicable, but the very afternoon that I resigned my former manager from Denver called and offered me a great new opportunity.


From My Minds Eye...

I recently attended a Leadership Institute at George Fox University on group discernment. In April, Renee and I went to India on a short term mission trip for Love Outreach. The primary purpose was to visit and work with Grace Home, LOM's new orphanage. We were very excited to see the work that Jesus himself is doing through LOM

Grace Home, which officially opened on January 20th, is run by Sam and his wife who are wonderful people. To provide some perspective on God at work: The vision to open the orphanage came to Sam, his wife, Jack and I in October of 2009. In a seemingly impossible time frame the orphanage was up and running. Already, the new home has taken in several children who would otherwise be wandering the streets. They are receiving food, clothing, shelter, education and God's love. We are very thankful to God with whom all things are possible.


One of the Love Outreach churches in Navam village became condemned due to several weather incidents. Because of this, we had to build a new church for the congregation who worshipped there. While Renee and I were in India the new church building was dedicated. People from various villages attended, and lunch was served after the dedication service. We went to many churches and homes in the area to minister the love of God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

This is now the 26th year for Love Outreach Ministries. Initially, it started with the preaching of the gospel and the distribution of groceries and clothes to the poor and needy. At the Lord's direction, LOM has grown and is currently serving God's Kingdom with two orphanages, eight churches, help to lepers, care for the sick and elderly, and the provision of immediate medical help to the poor.

Your prayers and financial seeds for this ministry are greatly appreciated and will be rewarded by God. I pray with Jack that the Lord will richly bless you.

After hearing the call from the Lord to go to India the first time in 2008, I didn't know if I would ever return, but knew I would keep praying. I was content to go or to stay. By God's grace I was able to return this past April.

Grace Home, a new orphanage was founded in a remote outcast village in South India. To see the work and verify the needs of the ministry, to pray and to encourage the gospel workers, this was the primary purpose of the trip.

After arriving and spending a couple of days recuperating and taking care of necessary business items - arranging transportation into the interior and making lodging arrangements etc, we began the various trips that were planned.

We were able to visit the Love Outreach Ministries' original orphanage, travel with Sister S. to witness baptisms and visit some of the churches planted. We shared our testimonies, heard their concerns, prayed for their needs and met some of the financial needs that were not previously known.

Later in the week, we were privileged to be a part of the dedication of the new church. Celebrating with many believers from surrounding villages and churches was a delight. But the primary purpose of the trip was to visit the new ministry of Grace Orphanage. How can I describe what I saw? I was so touched by the ministers of Grace. Pastor Sam and his wife along with a helper who cooks and assists, are not only caring for the children, but have founded a tiny church in the village, and more. Pastor Sam continues to work as a tailor to provide for his family. K is an auxiliary nurse midwife. Every day she rides with her boss on a motor scooter, often 2 hours or more, then hikes up into the mountains another hour or more, to meet some of the medical needs of the villagers who are completely cut off from the larger towns. Then they essentially stay in the pastors house for another 2-3 hours each day, meeting the basic medical needs of the people in the village and surrounding areas, on their own time. Pastor Sam is providing bus fare, traveling with some of the neediest folks 1-2 hours into the closest town for additional medical care, praying with and sharing the Gospel. The children are well cared for, and even while we were there touring and discussing the needs of the various children, a pastor from an even more remote village walked the many hours with an aged grandmother and two children to place in the orphanage. One little boy had no one left in his extended family to care for him, and the other had only the aged grandmother who will pass on soon. The needs are many, but Pastor Sam and his wife are shining in their dedication and creativity in caring for the children, assuring their schooling and building a better life for them.

Prayer Needs:

- Pray for all the children. For their health, their education, their spiritual, physical, social needs and other opportunities
- Pray especially for Abishek, a young boy with a seizure disorder who is living in the orphanage. He is non-verbal but is able to communicate with signs and gestures. Sometimes his seizures cause him to wander away so pray for his safety and for the Pastor and people of the village who are welcoming him and trying to meet his needs



- Pray for the tiny church. A member donated land and members raised the \$300 it took to build a little thatched shelter where they meet and pray each week on a dirt floor. Pray that funds would be provided to build a concrete building for them to worship and learn together
- Pray for a real clinic to be built in the town.
- Pray for Pastor Sam, his wife and their own children that their needs would be provided for as they work so diligently caring for others







More Mission's Moments...

Sunday May 16 we were so pleased to welcome back to the pulpit and Corona, Victor Rodriguez from Latin America Missions. Victor and his wife Elaine have a long history with Corona, going back more than 30 years when Victor was a young man and met the Rev. Lutz who visited his home in Bogotá, Columbia. While attending Denver Seminary, Victor worked with the youth of the church and now all those folks are grownups with youth of their own! Victor and Elaine's ministry is located in Miami, FL. There are many aspects to their ministry, but one of the main focuses is a bilingual counseling service that provides needed mental, emotional and spiritual help through biblical principles and values. At the early service Victor shared his story of conversion as a young man, and spoke during Sunday school and then again at the second service on the struggles of people who are married.

We are always blessed when our missionaries come to share with us what is happening in their lives and ministries and we have an opportunity to pray with them and for them. Please remember to keep Victor and Elaine in your prayers.

On a recent Saturday this May. Helen Soares graduated from Mills College. College graduation is not that unusual, but Helen's age was. Helen is 94! She had "YMI". "YMI" in her case means she had the "Vision" to graduate from college, she also had the "Means" of the art history classes provided at Mills, and she certainly had the "Intention" ever since graduating from high school in 1932.

We also need to have "YMI" with regard to our spiritual growth for our lifetime, if we are going to reach our spiritual potential: "same old. same old" is not what our lord has in mind for us! for us a good "Vision" would be to become more like Christ (Romans 8:29). This "Vision" would mean that our character would be showing more evidence of the fruits of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22).
