


Corona Presbyterian Church, Denver, CO

EDUCATION? Plenty. A Denver native, Georgia attended Wyatt Elementary, Morey Jr. High, graduated from East High School in 1941, received a degree in Education from the University of Northern Colorado, Greeley in 1951 and a Master's in Education from Denver University in 1961.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS Georgia taught in the Denver Public School system, Regis University, Loretto Heights University and UCD over her career and retired from DPS administration in 1984.

FAITHFUL SERVANT She taught Sunday school for 15+ years; served as an Elder for 6 years; clerk of session for 9 years; counseled youth at Insmont Presbyterian Camp near Bailey and remains faithful to her Missionary passion by serving on the Missions Committee.

Fun and Games Georgia played clarinet and sax at East High and then in various bands at Corona, including a very special Dixieland Band, helped with tons of silly skits and other wild and wacky entertainment for the congregation over the years. More hysterical stories than you could imagine. Just ask her.

FAMILY REALLY MATTERS Though never married, Georgia has had her hands full and took care of her ailing mother from 1963 - 1974 and still cares for her older mentally challenged brother to this day.

I mean I'm trying to think of excuses to say no but can't think of any". Speaking of focus. I've been noticing our neighbor of late- Dora Moore School. Not too long ago, I spent some time talking with Joan Wamsley, Dora Moore's principal. They are in dire need of people



to volunteer and help the school flourish in our community. I hear people talking about the need to see our world changed for Jesus. Here are some very practical ways. Dora Moore needs:

- Lunch room monitors and play ground monitors
- Tutors for their after school program
- People to help in the classrooms

Ask God if any of this is what He would have you be involved in? Ask God: where is your presence needed in our community surrounding the church and your own community. It really is time we ask those questions. I get the feeling God is asking us, 'where is your presence in these areas?'

May we keep our eyes on Jesus and may they be wide open!

"Corona Reads Through the Bible in One Year"

A number of folk in Corona have begun the process of reading through the Bible in one year, would you consider joining us? There are three ways that you might consider doing this:

- 1) Select 3 chapters in the Old Testament and 1 chapter in the New Testament to read each day
- 2) Select a daily reading from an online Bible reading plan (www. BiblePlan.org) that you download and place in your Bible to read each day
- 3) Purchase a 'Through the Bible in a Year Bible'. Examples are:
 - a) The One Year Bible, Living Bible version, www.tyndale.com
 - b) Pause, The Message version, www.navpress.com
 - c) The Daily Bible, NIV version, www.harvesthousepublishers.com by F. LaGard Smith, a chronological Bible
 - d) NIV The Daily Bible, NIV version, www.ibsdirect.com

If you have already read through the Bible try reading through this year in a different version!


