

From My Minds Eye...

I love the seasons of the Church calendar. It seems like just yesterday we were full throttle in Advent and Christmas. Now we are fast approaching Lent, Holy Week and Easter. These seasons of our church calendar provide us with a sense of rhythm for life.

Lent is a 40 day period time where historically and currently many church's encourage fasting and prayer in preparation for Holy Week. If you count



the days you will discover that it is actually 46 days in length. The Church does not count Sundays as part of Lent, but rather as a remembrance of Christ's resurrection. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday (March 9th) and concludes on Holy Saturday (April 23rd) the day before Easter Sunday. The 40 days represents the time Jesus spent in the desert overcoming temptation by Satan. The period of Lent is preparation, of soul searching and repentance all looking toward the incredible gift of our savior in His death and resurrection.

Historically Christians have fasted, abstained and repented during this season. I want to invite you to consider how you might participate in each of these spiritual disciplines. We don't participate in these spiritual disciplines to earn favor with God. Rather they help create space to recognize God, to hear God and to follow after God. Some would like a list of ways to engage in fasting, abstaining, and repenting; however I'm going to give you the freedom to simply ask and listen to God and perhaps those close to you as to how you might live these out.

And now for something completely different:

We want to welcome Oromo Evangelical Church who will be meeting at Corona on Sunday afternoons between 3:30 and 6:30 P.M. in our parlor. They are an Ethiopian congregation that has been looking for a place to worship. Some of you might remember that they used our facility several years ago for their worship service. Our Session feels very good about this opportunity to love our neighbors.

Throughout the weekend we examined how we can be in friendships with one another by exploring being trustworthy, being encouraging, providing guidance, and sharing our story and faith. In addition to our learning times, on Saturday afternoon some of the men learned how to rappel and throughout the weekend entirely too much food was consumed! Minute for Missions

We want to acquaint you with another opportunity coming up soon to provide spiritual support for our troops and their families as they meet the challenges of deployment and daily combat in Afghanistan. It is a daily email message that will be sent out during Lent (starts March 9th), one page in length, that will encourage many. The work on this is being done by Leslie Santee, a military mom who lives in Pagosa Springs, CO. She has several family members preparing for deployment to Afghanistan.

Leslie recently joined the staff of the Association for Christian Conferences, Teaching and Service (ACCTS), uses her video and media skills to help the development of Christian leaders in the armed forces of the world and in the establishment and growth of military Christian fellowships. She has been to Afghanistan twice, and has a good understanding of the situation there.

Leslie is developing an email campaign during Lent to encourage prayer for the people of Afghanistan, and for our military forces there. Her messages will address Afghanistan's history and its culture, the stresses on women & children in that war torn nation, the various tribal groups and how they relate (or don't), and the challenges facing our forces and their families.

This spring is a crucial time in the battle, and prayer is desperately needed for the nation and for the warriors on both sides of the conflict. ■AIRPORT PICK-UP PROGRAM■

This is a wonderful opportunity to meet an international student or scholar at one of their most needy or vulnerable times in their life... arriving in a new country. What internationals understand about America and its people comes from TV and movies. Hollywood has painted such a distortion of "who we are," particularly portraying Christians badly.

You can make a difference in the lives of these precious people by meeting them at the airport upon their arrival, taking them into your

home, sharing your life with them over a simple meal and giving them a warm, loving Christian home environment to stay in for their FIRST 3 NIGHTS IN THE USA. Your reaching out will have a lasting impression on these students. Most students are greatly touched by this act of kindness and are amazed that a stranger would welcome them in and accept them like a member of the family. Praying together for this student at mealtime is an awesome experience and opens great opportunities to share our Christian faith and lifestyle with them. You will take them to their apartment or dorm on campus and do what you can to help them get settled.

■INTERNATIONAL FRIENDSHIP PARTNER PROGRAM■

This is where the international student will really begin to feel part of our society. It can be very confusing and lonely for internationals when they arrive with so many different things to overwhelm them at the start. The Friendship Partner Program is designed to build a good relationship with the international student, help them learn how to open a bank account, go grocery shopping, how to get around or just meet their basic needs, allowing the love of Christ to flow through us into their hearts. ISI will provide quality training to prepare you for your cross-cultural experience.

If you wish to befriend an international student through the Friendship Partner Program, we ask that you spend time with your international student at least once a month (more often is better if possible) and call or email them weekly. The time that you spend with your student doesn't have to be formal. Welcoming them into our normal routines of mealtime, letting them see how we "really" live and act is best. It's great to invite them to special occasions with you also such as sporting events, concerts, and hiking. Invest in the lives of the future world leaders!


