Seeking God's call in the mission field of Turkey

fter one and a half days of travelling I ar- \triangle rived at the Antalya airport Feb 10 and was kindly picked up by Jim and Renata Bultema around dinner time. They took me along a back road to Paul and Lea's flat on the cliffs of Antalya by the Duden falls.

We talked about how they had come to serve in Turkey, initially hoping to reach Muslims in Germany. This began three weeks of questions and answers for me as I talked to many people who lived as "M's" in Antalya and listened to their stories.

My primary duties for the SPCC included having the privilege of reviewing the expansion drawings, measuring the furniture and drawing revised and more detailed layouts for the upstairs, the café, and the kitchens. Renata, Enez and I visited two commercial kitchen equipment stores and talked about the sizes as well as the practical locations for the range, refrigerator, dishwasher and glass cases in St. Paul's Café. We had a meeting with James, the architect, structural engineer - Carl, who is on the board at SPCC; and the accountant who

Most of the time that I spent in Antalya was behind the counter of the café, serving tea, coffee, espresso, sweet pastries and meals at lunch time. The afternoons I spent looking for work, which was a challenge in a foreign country.

Istanbul was a two day stop for me. The Kalkandelens had me over for dinner and worship. Ali told me that they would pray for direction for me and ended with prophesying over me - that I would be called a Turkish woman, as well as having a love ministry and ministering at the back door of the church to people who were ready to quit.

I am not clear on when all this is going to happen, but I am learning about the process of being called. Thanks so much for Corona's support.
