From My Minds Eye...



King David wrote (Psalm 107:1) “Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever!” This is the response of a man who has discovered and experienced the goodness and faithfulness of God. It has not been lost on David how God has been personally and intimately involved in his world, both in the good moments and the challenging ones. God has likewise been involved deeply in my world. There are times I am thankful. However, if I’m not careful I find myself missing ‘thankful’ moments.
