# The Teichert Family Minute for Missions

Here is a recent letter from one of our missionaries, Paul Teichert, serving in South Africa

"Look at the nations and watch and be utterly amazed. For I am going to do something in your days that you would not believe, even if you were told." Habakkuk 1:5

Dear Prayer Partners,

Thank you for your prayers for our successful church planting training in Madagascar. Over 45 leaders participated in the workshop to multiply evangelistic/discipleship groups that will form new churches in unreached villages of the rainforest. Most of the leaders walked and traveled up to three days from the central province of the rainforest region to attend the teaching. The training was facilitated by two brothers from Ethiopia and Madagascar and two other organizations also partnered with us. I have not included their names for security reasons.

The next step is for these 45 leaders to equip and develop 6-10 other church planters each to plant 1-2 new discipleship group/churches in the next 12 months. By God's grace, this will result in 600-900 new churches. Those who are successful will be invited with their new leaders to attend a follow-up training next July 2011. Our prayer is that these experienced leaders will then travel into the other four provinces of the unreached regions of the rainforest to multiply church planters and discipleship group/churches. Please pray for safety and fruitful training and church planting of these 45 leaders and their new church planters. Pray that God uses these leaders to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ and Biblebased discipleship movements to many who have never heard His name. Lastly, please pray for the financial provision for more training and Malagasy audio Bibles for many illiterate church planters and pastors. Please let us know if you would like more information.

Thank you for standing with us in prayer. We are grateful for your faithful intercession and partnership!

Following is an article from the "Value to Life Group" small group. They would like you to consider their thoughts on this upcoming ballot issue.

#### Value Life Group at Corona Taking a Stand to Make a Difference

The Value Life Group at Corona has set up a table in the foyer which expresses our hearts in valuing life. First, on the Colorado ballot this year there is an amendment called the Personhood Amendment or Amendment 62. Colorado actually has the only pro-life issue on the ballot this November in the nation. Obviously, that means that Colorado will be the target nationwide for people who propose or oppose this amendment. We will need all the prayers and help we can get to have more people vote for this measure. We ask that you stop by the table and pick up the literature and get informed on this amendment. We will be happy to answer questions to the best of our ability.

You will also notice that we have a letter from Presbyterians Pro-Life, a notice about 40 Days for Life, and the Wait No More Campaign sponsored by Focus on the Family. This is just a taste of the kinds of things the Value Life Group supports. Notice that the Wait No More campaign is about adoption. Alternatives Pregnancy Centers also promote adoption. We know that it is not enough just to oppose abortion. We must have things in place that give young women other options for saving their babies.

Pro-Life has been associated with the negative thought that we don't really care; that we want to force women to carry their babies to term. We know that is not the answer. We must be compassionate for the woman who is caught in such a dilemma. On the other hand, we cannot forget that there is another person involved here and the answer cannot be just to kill that person, the unborn baby. You may be one who has been affected or involved in an abortion in some way. Perhaps you don't like the idea of using the terms we prefer here such as child or baby or person. But we believe that, if you look at the facts, look at ultrasounds, and consider what God says (i.e. Psalm 139), you will begin to see another perspective on this topic.

We who are in Value Life Group and others that are pro-life are not here to see people suffer. It is quite the opposite. If you become informed about the consequences of abortion, even beyond the obvious (that a baby is killed), you will know that we are trying to relieve suffering. We are trying to stop the regrets and heartache of the realization that a child was killed; consciences are seared and there is guilt which can eat away at people's hearts and minds. 
## Corona Fall Church Workday

\$7.00 buys a girl her very own Scouting book at each program level.


\$12.00 pays the yearly registration fee to Girl Scouts of the USA.
