

### <u>Deacon's Corner August – September 2009</u>

Thanks to all of you who helped out and attended our First Annual Church Picnic. It was a wonderful time for all ages. For those of you who were unable to attend, you might want to find out who had dreams of being a professional wrestler when they grew up!! One of the purposes of this first picnic was to kick off the Koinonia Cell groups that the Deacons and Elders are organizing. Many questions were raised about just what Koinonia is. Koinonia is a Greek word that occurs 20 times in the Bible. Its primary meaning is "fellowship, sharing in common communion." Christian fellowship is a key aspect of the Christian life. Believers in Christ are to come together in love, faith and encouragement. That is the essence of koinonia. Koinonia is being in agreement with one another, being united in purpose and serving alongside each other. Our koinonia with each other is based on our common koionina with Jesus Christ.

Here at Corona, we have made a commitment to be a church that is a safe place to meet and grow in Christ. This involves creating a community of believers committed to caring for and serving with one another. In order to build Koionia with our church, each regular attendee or member is assigned to a Koinonia Cell group by zip code. Koinonia Cells are led by a leadership team of Elders and Deacons specific to that Cell. Koinonia Cells are designated by a color code. You will be contacted by your leadership team throughout the year and informed about opportunities to meet fellowship with and serve your fellow cell members. Koinonia Cells meet together twice a year to fellowship with one another. When you or your family are experiencing a need, calling the Koinonia Cell leaders will activate your cell to pray for you and to come alongside you in your time of need. As a cell member there will be times throughout the year that you will be called on to provide things like meals, transportation and support for the members of your cell.

We on the Board of Deacons are excited by the opportunity for growth that this program will provide for each of us individually and as a church. Be watching for more information about Koinonia Cells this fall. (continued on next page)

# ...TRUSTEE'S UPDATE... Church Improvements Planned

At its board meeting on September 1, the trustees approved three major improvement projects for the church. First, all but one of the toilets in the building will be replaced with high efficiency units requiring only 1 gallon per flush saving about 1.5 gallons of water on each flush. This project is being undertaken by the Mile High Youth Corps in partnership with the Denver Water Department which is providing the toilets all at not cost to the church. The toilets will be installed by the middle of September by the Youth Corps. The second project involves the refurbishing of the ladies' restroom off the Multi-purpose room which will include complete repainting, new tile, and some decorative touches. Finally, all the trees surrounding the building will be trimmed this month.

Also, the trustees wish to remind everyone of the fall workday which scheduled for the morning of Saturday, October 10, providing all an opportunity to contribute sprucing the grounds and improving the building. More details will follow as to the tasks which will be the focus of the workday.
