





Common Threads

First, we want to thank those who have been donating supplies for this ministry. Each piece, whether small or large, will be put to good use as we make new creations from remnants and scraps that look like they should be tossed.

Isn't this what God does with each of us? We often come to Him feeling like bits and pieces that don't make sense or that are useless...but then He makes us into new creations.

Common Threads has had the honor of giving several prayer shawls recently. We have teamed with Deacons in meeting needs of people, many within our congregation, as well as some strangers. But they are not strangers for long as we come alongside them in their time of need and these prayer quilts and shawls can become the tangible arms of God enfolding us.

Following is an excerpt from "Fabric of Faith", by Kimberly Winston, that explains the purpose of prayer shawls and prayer quilts by telling a story of receiving a quilt as a baby that stayed with her as her life unfolded...

"When my mother and I moved hundreds of miles away, that quilt went with me. When I held it next to me, I always felt safe and loved. Every night, I spread its yellow thinness out on my bottom sheet and lay down on top of it. It was my good luck charm, my anchor, my home.

Why should a quilt have such talismanic (protective) power? The truth is, it doesn't. Not by itself. But when a quilt is imbued with meaning, reinforced with love, and given away with compassion, it can become a shelter in times of sickness, heartache, and uncertainty. Made with love, purpose, and hope, such a quilt can become an unbreakable link to a community that nurtures us and a tangible reminder that we are all bound up together in God's world."



Last month we had the honor of giving our latest baby quilt to Peppard Murphy, newborn daughter of Nathan and Kristin. This blanket will be a reminder to Peppard and her parents of their time here at Corona as they move back East for work and to be near family.

We appreciate your continuing support of this ministry with your donations of yarn, ribbon, fabric and pillow cases, which can be left in the large box in the foyer area. We currently meet the first Thursday of the month at 10am at the church. We also come together to pray over quilts and shawls, often at our Thursday meeting, but also on Sundays. Anyone is welcome to join us as we sew and knit and crochet and quilt and of course in praying over these shawls and quilts.

Looking forward to what God will do with our little scraps and pieces...



Summer has been a busy time for our Church family. There have been many members with illness or injury and our visitation team has been busy! Thank you for your continued contributions to the Deacon's Fund and the Food Basket Ministry and the Communion Sunday Flower Ministry.

Flower Ministry: On every Communion Sunday the Welcome and Hospitality committee will provide three small plants or flower bouquets which will greet you at the entry door and then be delivered by the Deacons after service to our shut-ins and others needing a blessing. Fresh flowers and/or little plants can brighten up someone's day! If you would like to sponsor the "Communion Sunday Bouquets of Blessing", sign up on the bulletin board above the nametag table. Bless you.

Food Basket Ministry: We have purchased a new freezer which is now filled with frozen food goods to supply to those in need including frozen meat and vegetable boxes from Angel Food Ministries. In addition, there will continue to be pantry boxes for dry good needs. Our goal is to also have about a weeks' worth of home cooked casseroles available so that we can be 'ready to roll' for the needs of families within the congregation when there is a death or illness. The deacons will provide disposable freezer dishes. Please label with cooking/warming instructions and ingredients so we can avoid allergens.

Dear Elaine and the Corona Elder Board,

"...Thanks to you and the other faithfuls who serve without pay and mostly without thanks. We appreciate very much your hard work and believe that those of us who benefit from Corona are fortunate to have folks like you working for the Kingdom.

We live half the year in the Middle East, where Jim is a psychologist-tent-maker. His practice entails the 20 nationalities that attend our diverse evangelical church in Abu Dhabi and some of the 170 nationalities who work there; Christians, Muslims, Hindus, and Agnostics. Several have come to faith in Christ in the last 11 years, and our church has played an important role in their salvation and growth. We are in Denver the other half of the year and have been part of probably 20 churches in our lives. Nancy's job as a diplomat found us moving every 2-4 years so we've had the opportunity to be part of many different bodies. Last year we looked for 5 months to find Corona and you are a special group.

This letter is to ask you to consider remaining with the one Sunday worship service. It's a blessing to see a larger group and we think the spirit of 100 folks in one strong service instead of 50 folks in each single service is great and better for our unity of spirit. Thanks for considering and praying about this..."
