Corona provides Child care and various educational offerings for children and youth:

During the church service and Sunday school, we offer **child care** in both of our nurseries.

- The nursery next to the sanctuary is for infants,
- The nursery upstairs is for children ages 1 through 3.

We offer <u>Children's Church to all children ages 4 through 3rd grade</u>. If you would like your children to attend Children's Church, please keep them with you <u>during the service</u> until they are dismissed to Children's Church. Their teacher will meet them at the back of the sanctuary. If you have a younger child who would like to attend Children's Church, we just ask that you speak with their teachers (Jan Goellner and Jessica True) about that.

We also provide <u>Sunday school for children from 11:15-12 noon</u>. There is a preschool class for 3-5 year olds, a class for kindergarteners, 1st and 2nd graders, and a class for 3rd, 4th and 5th graders. These classrooms are located upstairs.

THE SEASON OF LENT – A JOURNEY TO THE CROSS

Lent is a season of letting go. Observers commonly choose something on which they find they have come to depend, something with which they indulge themselves, and determine to forego that item during the Lenten season. The first week or so determination runs high and success seems assured; however, as the days drag into weeks, many find their resolve weakening, and at times failing altogether. It is at this time that God, in our weakness, is glorified. We must remember that by ourselves we can do nothing, but that we can do all things when it is Christ who strengthens us.

RELEASE - So many times we think we know what will please us, what will be best for us. Often we grasp and cling stubbornly to it, knowing down deep that it is not for us, but clenching our fists none the less. We feel as if our fingers must be pried open before we begrudgingly release whatever we were holding fast.

RECEIVE – God has blessings that he longs to lavish upon us. He knows, better than we know ourselves, what will satisfy the deepest longings of our heart that we try to meet with cheap imitations. It is only by releasing to him that which we hold dear that our hands are open, placed in a position able to receive all the treasures of heaven which he has in store for us and to live the life of abundance he longs to give us.
